

Lake District Guide


Sedbergh's location nestled on the edge of the South Lakes and within the Yorkshire Dales National Park means you get to explore the best of both worlds.

Plan your visit to some of the amazing places in the Dales area.








Sedbergh Tourist Information




Adventures in & around Sedbergh



Walks & hikes


There's a great selection of walks from easy riverside strolls to demanding felltop adventures. Arm yourself with a map, compass and a pack of sandwiches (and possibly a waterproof!)



Mountain biking


There are a lot of great routes in the area including 'the Bowderdale Classic' often voted one of the best bits of singletrack in the country.





Cautley Spout Waterfall

Visit the magnificent waterfall at Cautley Spout (on the outskirts of Sedbergh) and enjoy a well deserved cuppa at the end at the Cross Keys which is a 400 year old National Trust Temperance Inn.

Golf

Sedbergh Golf Club welcomes individual golfers, small groups and golfing societies to the golf club on any day of the week, subject to availability. There's also a bar and restaurant serving traditional pub food.



Canoeing

Four rivers meander their way through Sedbergh: the Lune, the Rawthey, the Clough and the Dee. Sedbergh is a paddler`s playground for both the experienced or novice canoeist or kayaker. Lessons for all ages and abilities can be booked at Killington Lake with ComeKayaking.





Horse riding

Enjoy some of the best off-road horse-riding trails in England, using old green lanes, tracks and historic bridleways across the Howgill Fells, the Mallerstang Valley, Crosby Garrett Fell, Ash Fell and the wideopen green tracks of Kirkby Stephen common.

Farfield Mill


Home to artisan craft workshops, exhibition spaces, working looms, a mill shop, pre-loved book shop and tea room, this restored Victorian woolen mill is a hub for creative enterprises. Take a riverside walk and discover its textile heritage.



Book Town

Explore the bookshops that give Sedbergh its Book Town crown. There's even a converted bus shelter where you can exchange books for free. Or why not spend a rainy afternoon perusing the range of books in the local cafes and pubs.






Quaker trail

Sedbergh School


Sedbergh School has been a boarding school since 1525 and now offers a mixed education for boys and girls. The School is renowned for its sporting success and there are often cricket and rugby fixtures held in the Town. The annual 'Wilson Run' began in 1881. It's a gruelling 10 mile run, across 12 fells, over 300m high.



Motte and bailey


Castlehaw Tower is a small well preserved motte and bailey castle. The motte and bailey is very well defined, with readily identifiable: motte, bailey, ditches and ramparts all surviving intact. The motte was used as an air raid look out during World War II.






Churches

There are various churches and places of worship in and around Sedbergh.



Howgill fellside Icecream


Roger and Suzan Sedgwick have invested in the latest Italian technology using the milk produced on the farm to create handmade dairy ice cream.



Ingleton water fall trail & lido

The nearby village of Ingleton (approx. 30 minutes by car) offers a full day of family entertainment. There's an open air pool next to a play park and you can also explore the beauty of the waterfalls on a 4 miles trail (8km). The Waterfalls Trail is unsuitable for prams and pushchairs due to the number of steps.





Park


There's a Play Park and Sports Field next to the Village Hall (People's Hall) on Howgill Lane.

Stargazing

Sedbergh, the Howgill Fells and the lanes and farms round about, are fantastic places to enjoy the night sky because there is little light pollution – even in town!

The Cross Keys

The Cross Keys is a 400 year old National Trust
Temperance Inn situated at the bottom of
Cautley Spout, England's highest waterfall.
Delightfully quirky inside you'll be charmed by
the rustic range fires and vintage furniture as you
enjoy a bite to eat.



Wensleydale Creamery

Located in the nearby village of Hawes you can now enjoy an interactive experience that takes you on a journey through the art of cheesemaking. Watch Wensleydale cheese being made in the creamery. Visitors can also enjoy a full programme of cheese-making and buttermaking demonstrations, as well as delicious cheese tastings.





Artisan Markets

The Sedbergh Artisan Markets are community-based events specialising in art and crafts and a wide variety of local and regional food, all offered for sale by the artisans themselves. They are held one Saturday a month during the warmer months on the Main Street.
